Slow mounding coniferous evergreen. Each leaf is bent backward showing silver side up. Noted for full size cones. (Zone 5-7)

**Acer Palmatum ‘Aoyagi’**

A green counterpart to ‘Sango Kaku’ the bright pea-green color of the leaves and bark of this cultivar is equally as spectacular as its cousin. Bark color is intense during the winter months.

**Acer Palmatum ‘Arakawa’**

‘Rough Bark Maple’ is named for the character of its bark rather than the characteristics of its leaves. A green upright cultivar, its growth habit is vigorous and bark very distinctive with a corky look.

**Acer Palmatum ‘Shindeshojo’**

Perhaps the Japanese Maple with the most distinctive foliage colors. In the spring the leaves are a brilliant scarlet color for a month or so, changing in midsummer to a reddish-green, and in the fall blends of red and orange. This cultivar draws attention.

**Acer Palmatum ‘Red Pygmy’**

Red maroon leaves with long narrow lobes, the entire effect of these delicate leaves is lace-like. Color holds well through hot weather and deepens. As it matures the plant broadens rather than growing more upright.

—ACER PALMATUM DISSECTUM—

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Crimson Queen’**

Full and faster growing laceleaf that holds its deep red color throughout the summer season.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Garnet’**

Vigorous laceleaf, red-orange in color that holds well in direct sun through the summer heat. Forms into cascading, well-mounded shape. A great landscape plant.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Inaba Shidare’**

A more upright-growing form with a vigorous growth habit. Sturdy and differing from the other red dissectums in its individual leaf shape and color.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Tamukeyama’**

Hardy plant with deep crimson-red leaf color. Cultivar dates back to the 18th Century. Tolerant of both heat and humidity.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Viridis’**

The better known of the less common green dissectums. Very distinctive plant that matures into a nice dome-shape.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Red Dragon’**

A laceleaf that can reach 10' at maturity. It starts in the spring with a Christmas-red color and by fall is more purple.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Filigree Green’**

As its name depicts this is a very delicate appearing plant with light, almost yellow-green, deeply dissected leaf, with flecks of pale gold or cream overlaying the green. Vertrees' admitted favorite cultivar. . .“so difficult to describe that personal inspection is necessary”.

**Acer Palm. Diss. ‘Red Select’**

A small-leaf dissectum as compared to other cultivars, which has a green tone with red markings on tips and margins in early summer. Fall color ranges from a rich purple-red to more of a scarlet-red.

Deciduous shrub or small tree. New foliage is orange fading to green with purple hues.

**Betula Pendula Youngii**

Slender branches that hang straight down. Has a form like weeping Mulberries but is more graceful. A decorative display tree. (Zone 2-7)

**BUXUS**

**Buxus Sempervirens**

Dark green broadleaf evergreen shrub, maturing at 15' high by 15' wide. Dense multi-branched with a round or broad-round shape. (Zone 5-8)

**Buxus Sempervirens Suffruticosa**

This dwarf Boxwood is ideal for edging. A dense, compact and slow growing broadleaf evergreen shrub. May be kept at a few inches high but can reach 4-5' after many years. (Zone 5-8)

Lustrous dark green broadleaf evergreen shrub. Leaves are dark on top and a light green or yellow underside year round. A dense branched round shrub maturing at 15' high by 15' wide.

**CARPINUS**

**Carpinus Japonica**

*Japanese Hornbeam.* Medium sized shade tree having a fan shape, with narrow and deeply impressed leaves that have a 3-dimensional appearance, dark green in summer and red in the fall. Very disease resistant. (Zone 4-9)

**Cedrus Atlantica Glauca**

A rapid-growing conical plant, rich blue in color, with open branching and stately form. (Zone 6-9)

**CERCIS**

**Cercis Canadensis**

*Eastern Redbud* - Largest and fastest growing of the available species. Prefers to take a tree form of 25-35' with a rounded head. Branches are horizontally tiered. Rich green leaves with pointed tips and small rosy pink flowers. (Zone 5-9)

Columnar and compact in growth habit foliage is blue-green in color.

*Golden Dwarf Hinoki Cypress.* Slow growing, compact gold evergreen shrub.

*Kosteri Dwarf Hinoki Cypress.* Slow growing dwarf tree with globular form. (Zone 4-8)

**Chamaecyparis Obtusa ‘Compacta’**

*Compact Hinoki Cypress.* A broad conifer, columnar and upright in habit, dark green leaves, white banded beneath. Matures at 30' high by 15' wide. (Zone 4-8)

**Chamaecyparis Obtusa ‘Confucious’**

*Confucious Dwarf Hinoki Cypress.* A dense dwarf with upright growth habit and golden color. Tear shaped leaves show an orange on gold winter color. (Zone 4-8)

**Chamaecyparis Obtusa ‘Nana Gracilis’**

*Dwarf Hinoki Cypress.* Dwarf form of ‘Gracilis’ matures at 10'. (Zone 4-8)

**Chamaecyparis Obtusa ‘Graciosa’**

*Graciosa Hinoki Cypress.* A sport of ‘Nana Gracilis’, but with more feathery dark green leaves. Matures at 10'. (Zone 4-8)

*Hinoki Cypress.* Broad, conical, conifer with soft, stringy bark. Matures at 40'. (Zone 4-8)

**Cornus Alternifolia**

Medium growing large shrub or small tree with nice horizontal branching. Cream colored flowers in Spring followed by blue black berries in the Fall. (Zone 4-8)

The Giant Dogwood is very vigorous, needs room to spread its magnificent long, tiered branches, a very distinctive trademark.

Strong growing and durable plant, produces yellow blooms in early spring that later produce bright red berries (Cornelian cherry) in late summer. Offered in tree or multistem form. (Zone 5-8)

### Cornus Florida

---

#### 'Cherokee Chief'

Clean and strong growing plant with a dominant leader, deep ruby red bracts that hold their color well. Bright scarlet fall color. (Zone 5-8)

#### 'Cherokee Brave'

A new red variety discovered as a chance seedling. It is a more vigorous C. Florida with a deep red bloom similar to 'Chief' (Zone 5-8)

#### 'Cloud 9'

Prolific clean white blossoms make this variety, with its spreading growth habit, very attractive. (Zone 5-8)

#### Cornus Florida 'Cherokee Daybreak'

Variiegated dogwood with broad oval to ovate green leaves with white margins that turn red to purple in autumn. Fruit is bright red. (Zone 5-8)

#### Cornus Florida 'Cherokee Princess'

White flowering Dogwood whose blooms in late spring are green with yellow tips and eventually turn white. A vigorous grower with slightly twisted or curled leaves that turn red and purple in the fall. The flowers are followed by bright red, ovoid fruit. (Zone 5-8)

#### Cornus Florida 'First Lady'

Medium growing Dogwood with unusual variegated foliage. Blooms young with creamy white flowers in late Spring. Height 8 to 10 feet. (Zone 5-8)

### Cornus Kousa

---

#### Cornus Kousa Chinensis

*Chinese White Kousa Dogwood.* Deciduous tree, loaded in spring with small white flowers that are followed by raspberry-like fleshy red fruit. Foliage turns crimson purple in autumn. (Zone 5-8)

#### Cornus Kousa 'National'

Large creamy white star-shaped bloom on dark green foliage. A vigorous grower and resistant to disease. (Zone 5-8)

More floriferous Kousa with large white bracts.

#### Cornus Kousa 'Miss Satomi'

Imported from Japan this relatively new variety is gaining a large following with considerable enthusiasm. It is a vigorous plant with a truly red bloom. The deep green leaves turn crimson in the fall. (Zone 5-8)

#### 'The Stellar Series'

A family of hybrids developed by Dr. Elwin Orton at Rutgers University with a floral period equal to C. Florida. Plants display the better features of both C. Florida and C. Kousa. Patented. (Zone 5-8)

Very vigorous grower, tree is loaded with white blooms that turn creamy with age.

#### Cornus 'Rutdan' 'Celestial'

Blooms a few days later than most C. Florida and early bracts have a slight green tinge.

#### Cornus 'Rutcan' 'Constellation'

White, more obovate bracts that do not overlap.

#### Cornus 'Rutlan' 'Ruth Ellen'

A very vigorous grower loaded with brilliant white blooms at the peak of the bloom.

#### Cornus 'Rutgan' 'Stellar Pink'

The only pink bloomer in this series. This plant is also a vigorous grower.

### Fagus Sylvatica Pendula

*Green Weeping European Beech.* Weeping deciduous tree. Leaves are pale green at bud break, turn dark green, then yellow to orange-brown in fall. (Zone 4-7)

### Fagus Sylvatica ‘Purple Fountain’

*Purple Fountain Weeping European Beech.* Plant grows in narrow upright fashion. Leaves are deep purple and wavy-margined. Matures at 20' high by a narrow 3' wide. (Zone 4-7)

### Fagus Sylvatica ‘Riversii’

*Riversii Purple European Beech.* Large very dark purple leafed deciduous beech. (Zone 4-7)

### Fagus Sylvatica ‘Roseomarginata’

*Tri-color European Beech.* Large purple leaves edged in pink and white. (Zone 4-7)

### Fagus Sylvatica ‘Dawyck Purple’

*Dark Purple European Beech.* Narrow in form. Purple leaves remain dark through much of the growing seasons. (Zone 4-7)

### Juniperus Procumbens Nana (Standard)

*Dwarf Japanese Garden Juniper.* Unusual horizontal and stellate shaped growth habit elevated from the ground on a standard, giving this plant a very distinctive look. In the upright form it has a twisting shape, spiraling vertically trained around a stake. (Zone 5-9)

### Larix Decidua Pendula

*Weeping European Larch.* Weeping deciduous conifer with scaly gray bark. Pale green leaves turn straw yellow in fall before dropping for the winter. (Zone 3-6)

### Larix Kaempferi ‘Diana’

Conical conifer with pink winter shoots and leaves turn gold in fall. Grows to 110' by 20' wide (Zone 5-7)
